Physical Education Program

Immanuel has offered an extensive physical education program to all students grades K-12. In addition to a variety of indoor and outdoor activities our students also participate in the Presidential Physical Fitness Program and Junior Olympics. PE clothes are purchased in the school office for 6th – 12th grades.

Hot Lunch Program

Hot lunches are offered several days a week by our senior class. Milk is available daily. Order forms and payments for milk/lunches are made directly to the office.

Sports Programs

Immanuel has offered a wide variety of interscholastic sports including volleyball, football, basketball, baseball, softball, cross-country, track, golf and swim teams. Enrichment Programs
